Graduation (Completion) Rates

The overall graduation rate for students who began their studies in:

Bachelor's Degrees

2015 was 40% (4 of 10)

2014 was 56% (5 of 9)

2013 was 50% (7 of 14)

The reporting standard for completion specifies a time frame of 150% of published time to complete a bachelor's degree. (Thus, the reporting format allows six years to complete a four-year program and three years to complete a two-year program.)

Please Note: Many colleges use a reporting formula for completion that excludes entering students who do not intend to finish a full four-year program at that college. St. Louis Christian College includes in its completion rate every First-Time Full-Time student, including those who perceive a benefit from enrolling for fewer credits than the number required to complete a degree. Colleges also may report students as completing a degree program who transfer to another college before doing so. St. Louis Christian College reports students who transfer to another college as non-completers.

Job Placement Rate for Graduates

100-Day Survey of Recent Graduates

August 2020 (11 of 16 responded = 69%)

- 89% of those seeking employment are serving in a church or para-church organization
- 88% of those working in a ministry setting are working within their SLCC major field of study

August 2019 (8 of 15 responded = 53%)

- 80% of those seeking employment are serving in a church or para-church organization
- 75% of those working in a ministry setting are working within their SLCC major field of study

August 2018 (6 of 25 responded = 24%)

- 83% of those seeking employment are serving in a church or para-church organization
- 83% of those working in a ministry setting are working within their SLCC major field of study

5-Year Survey of Alumni

August 2020 (Class of 2015 — 5 of 21 responded = 24%)

- 60% are currently working in a ministry context
- 75% of those working in a ministry setting are working within their SLCC major field of study
- 80% have taken graduates courses or obtained a Masters' Degree

August 2019 (Class of 2014 — 11 of 42 responded = 26%)

- 77% are currently working in a ministry context
- 88% of those working in a ministry setting are working within their SLCC major field of study
- 45% have taken graduates courses or obtained a Masters' Degree
